
## UNDER THE MIDNIGHT SUN: JOURNEY WITH THE SAHTU DENE

**Lesson Plan Suggestions** 

## Quotations

In this lesson, students will find a quotation that resonates with them and discuss its possible impact on their lives.

To begin, explain how to reference quotations. Also explain the difference between a person's words (direct quotation) and quoting from a book. You might also take this opportunity to explain the importance of a Reference page when writing an essay.

Students will review parts of the book that are most meaningful to them. Each student will choose a statement or phrase that they find inspiring or insightful. Each student will write their quotation on a post-it note and put it on the classroom wall.

Students should be prepared to explain whether their quotation was made by a person or is a statement from the book's narration. They should also be able to explain the context.

Finally, they should explain how the words might influence them in the future in terms of the decisions they might make or their feelings about a situation.

## **FOR MORE FUN**

Students could team up to discuss their quotations. Did they interpret the meaning differently? Why are some quotations powerful? Do you agree with the themes?
